Chair's Report (Councillor Maria Gatland)

Our tenth anniversary AGM was a great success. It was very well attended and the magic show to celebrate our anniversary was a talking point for weeks. It was important as well to remember just how much the Friends have achieved over the ten years from our first project clearing the bank on Upper Selsdon Road to the recent removal of one hectare of invasive holly. One of my favourites was the recreation of the meadow shown on old maps but all of them benefit the Hurst in many ways not just for the present but for the future. None of this would have been possible without the hard work of so many and the support of the local community. I hope the next ten years will be as productive.

I frequently request Croydon Council to clear graffiti or remove dumped rubbish or unusually recently a burnt out motor bike. It continues to surprise and at times anger me that some people use our beautiful woods as a dumping ground. Just recently a Christmas tree was dumped on the green, I am grateful to the Council for removing it following my request. Dumping of any kind is not acceptable and is illegal. Most people love and care for the Hurst, many pick up litter every day. A few show no respect for our ancient woodland that contributes so much to our local area.

The Hurst looked stunning in the snow, it was full of people, families, and dogs all having fun. Some members remember when it was normal to see so many children in the Hurst but now it is only when snow falls. I am really pleased to report that the Hurst will be one of the sites used by Elmhurst School for a Forest School. It will only be used for a few hours on selected dates and will be watched over by the Council because it is a nationally important site. What an opportunity for young children to learn about the trees, animals and plants and much more. Hopefully they will be champions of the Hurst in the future. I saw so many taking photos of the Hurst in the snow. Why not send them to our new website.

Following a recent meeting with the Forestry Adviser to the Council to discuss future projects, he has sent me two proposals. The first would be the removal of another area of holly, the recent removal had a stunning impact bringing light, warmth and regeneration. The second proposal would be the restoration of the historic view from the top of the Hurst much obscured now by growth. This would entail the removal of some trees. It is important to remember that although both proposals will cause some problems and disruption the benefits for the Hurst, for us and the next generations will be huge. I think it is a good use of the funds so generously donated.
